The National Exchange Club Rocky Mountain District Ace & Youth of the Year Club Chairpersons

The information provided within this letter is intended to produce for your club a foundation and procedure for submitting to The Rocky Mountain District qualified candidates for awards of "District Youth of the Year" and "District A.C.E. Award Winner."

YOUTH OF THE YEAR

Your club president should have received all information from National on the "Youth of the Month/Year" Award program for 2007. These project guides provide explanation and guidance on how to participate in this special community youth project, in addition to information on the National Youth of the Year Program.

This years Youth of the Year Essay topic is "Lighting the Fire Within."

Monday April 16th, 2007 is the final day Applications with Essays may be turned into the Rocky Mountain District. A District winner will be selected the week of May 7th and will be submitted to the National Exchange Club prior to June 1st 2007.

The District winner will be honored at the District Convention held in Estes Park, Colorado June 14^{th} –17th with an award of \$750.00 as scholarship funds to assist with their further education. The National Youth of the Year winner will receive a scholarship of \$10,000 in two installments. The first of which will be presented at the 2007 Convention held July 18^{th} – 21^{st} in Portland, Oregon and the second at the time the winner registers for his or her second year of college.

A.C.E. AWARD

This is the eleventh year the Rocky Mountain District has presented the A.C.E. Award, and it is the seventh year this award is being presented by the National organization.

The "Accepting the Challenge of Excellence" award recognizes a student who has made a dramatic change in their attitude and performance during their high school years, and as such is now eligible for High School Graduation.

Wednesday April 18th, 2007 is the deadline for applications and letters to be turned into the Rocky Mountain District. A District winner will be selected the week of May 7th, and will be honored at the District Convention June 14th-17th. A \$750.00 cash scholarship will be presented to the student who will be continuing their education.

The District winner will be submitted for the National Award prior to June 1st. National will award a \$10,000 scholarship in a manner similar to the Youth of the Year award at the convention in Portland, Oregon on July 18th or July 19th, 2007. The National Exchange Club will provide a convention package to the honoree and his or her two chaperons.

<u>PLEASE NOTE</u>: Candidates in order to be eligible must be able to accept this award in person at the District Convention to be held June 14th -17th, in Estes Park, Colorado and at the Youth Recognition Luncheon in Portland, Oregon on the 18th or 19th of July.

Each Club will be allowed to submit only one candidate to the District. The district has the option to select two candidates for submission to National if they meet the qualifications and are of opposite sex.

Youth of the Year Entry Form

THE DISTRICT AND NATIONAL YOUTH OF THE YEAR AWARD OFFICIAL ENTRY FORM

INSTRUCTIONS

The entry form is divided into five parts. Sections 1 and 2 address the candidate's achievements during 5 of his or her final 6 semesters in high school. This information is normally obtained from school records. Sections 3 and 4 are to be prepared by the candidate. Section 5 must be filled out in full.

All grading should be based on a 5 semester period beginning with the sophomore (10th grade) year and ending with the close of the first semester of the senior (12th grade) year. Make sure to enter a score for each semester in each appropriate activity column as well as a total.

Section 1a — Activities

Student Government/Class Government - Grade on basis of highest office held per group each semester.

Newspaper/Annual School Publication - Grade on basis of highest position held per publication each semester.

Musical Organization - Band denotes any musical group which is school-sponsored. Choir denotes any vocal group which is school-sponsored. Orchestra denotes a formal symphonic musical organization which is school sponsored, but not included in band activities. Drum major/majorette must be part of school-sponsored activity.

Debate Activities - Winner denotes any recognized award achieved as an individual or as a member of a team in either an inter- or intra-school competition. However, only one such victory may be counted per semester. Team denotes any group representing either a high school class or the high school as a whole. If the candidate receives a score as a winner and is part of a team, he or she should also receive credit for team membership.

Stage Production - Performer denotes active participation on stage as a member of a theatrical or similar school-sponsored production. Production Crew denotes participation in an activity necessary to support a school performance (i.e. stage hand, projectionist, makeup,

etc.). Only one performance may be counted per semester.

Athletic Teams, Club Membership - see explanation on entry form.

Section 1b — Community Service Activities Community Organization Membership and Volunteer Service Hours - see explanation on entry form.

Section 2 — Grades

Grade point average is for semester period beginning with the sophomore (10th grade) year and ending with the close of the first semester of the senior (12th grade) year. Multiply the student's G.P.A. (using the 4.0 system) by 50 to get the score for Section 2. G.P.A. may not exceed 4.0.

Section 3 — Special Achievements/Awards

List 10 special achievements and awards, specifying if local, state or national. Attach a typewritten paragraph describing most outstanding achievement. This section, which can be awarded up to a maximum of 160 points, will be scored by the national judges.

Section 4 - Essay

Signature of District President

Each nominee will be responsible for preparing an essay on a subject selected by The National Exchange Club. The essay must be within 800 - 1,200 words. Although grammatical correctness and proper use of accepted rules of composition will be considered, points will be awarded primarily on the basis of the overall impact of the essay on the judges. Therefore, logical and clear development, as well as the persuasiveness of the argument are most important. The purpose of the essay is to provide the judges with a deeper insight into the character and beliefs of the nominee, and the nominee's ability to clearly communicate with the reader. Based on these impressions, judges may award the essay up to 300 points. (Please attach the typewritten essay to this form.)

Accepting the Challenge of Excellence Award A.C.E.

THE DISTRICT AND NATIONAL A.C.E. AWARD OFFICIAL ENTRY FORM

Purpose

The A.C.E. Award recognizes high school students who have made a dramatic change in their attitude and performance sometime during their high school years, and are now eligible for high school graduation. These "at risk" students have often overcome great physical, emotional or social obstacles, yet few receive recognition.

This is a positive program with two key objectives. First, it helps encourage students to overcome their hardships and get back on track toward a high school diploma. Second, the award recognizes those students who are often overlooked for their accomplishments. This special recognition serves as a powerful example to all students that hard work and perseverance really do pay.

The submission deadline for the National A.C.E. Award is June 1. The winner will be presented the A.C.E. Award and a \$10,000 scholarship at the National Convention. Travel accommodations will be provided to the winner and his/her parents/guardians.

Instructions

- 1. Contact your local high school for a potential candidate for the award. A partial list of difficulties to overcome could include physical,
 - language, child abuse, delinquency or substance abuse.
- 2. Ensure that the candidate will graduate from high school this year.
- 3. Obtain school official and parent/guardian signatures.
- 4. Recognize the selected individual at an appropriate club meeting.
- 5. If you plan to enter your candidate in the district competition, your club A.C.E. Award chairperson must prepare the description narrative (275 words max.) and have the candidate write their two brief (250 words max.) narratives.
- 6. The district may use the same judging procedure as National or determine their own selection process.
- 7. The district may select one or two (if opposite sex) candidates to submit to National by June 1st. Advise candidate that he or she may be contacted by a representative of The National Exchange Club to obtain additional information for publicity purposes.

Listed below are some hints and references to additional forms that may prove helpful as you approach the effort to find the best qualified candidates for the youth programs this year.

- 1. The National Exchange Club Awards Book for 2006-2007 has the necessary instructions and application forms for ACE and Youth of the Year awards if you need additional forms. Refer to pages 59 through 64. Your club president should have this book.
- 2. You can also obtain the forms and additional information on the National Exchange Club Web site (national exchange club.com).
- 3. Attached is an abbreviated "Information Sheet" which some of the clubs use as a tool in their Youth of the Month selection process. Since the essay required for District and National submission isn't required for local club evaluation for Youth of the Month applicants, you may want to consider using this sheet in the selection process and only require the longer essay for the district/national applicant submission.
- 4. Some clubs also use the attached "Scoring Sheet" to track the applicants during the interview process. Sometimes the strengths and weaknesses of each applicant is forgotten after you get to the third, fourth or fifth interview. This sheet can help you record your impressions during the interview itself, or shortly thereafter.
- 5. Understand the scholarship awards available at the club, district and national level. Consider using this information to motivate applicants to get involved. Be sure to have a clear understanding of your club's budget as you start the process.
- 6. For the Youth of the Year Award be aware that your club president has to certify on the official application that the district/national applicant from your club was chosen from among six (6) Youth of the Month winners.

- 7. Make sure you validate with your district/national applicant that they can schedule their time to attend the District Convention in June and the National Convention in July if they are chosen as the District winner.
- 8. Be sure to alert early in the awards process that a 5" X 7" black and white glossy picture must be included with the application submitted to district/national. This issue has delayed submission in the past.
- 9. Be courteous and send letters to both award winners and those who were interviewed but didn't win. Some sample letters for your consideration are attached.
- 10. Refer to the submission deadlines for both awards. Give yourself plenty of time to schedule and hold the interviews, give the applicants time to complete forms and get the necessary reference letters, grade transcripts, etc.
